1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

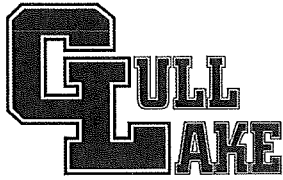
Richland Elementary is a public school accepting any student who is a resident of our school district. We also accept school of choice students from within Kalamazoo County (105) and contiguous counties (105c).

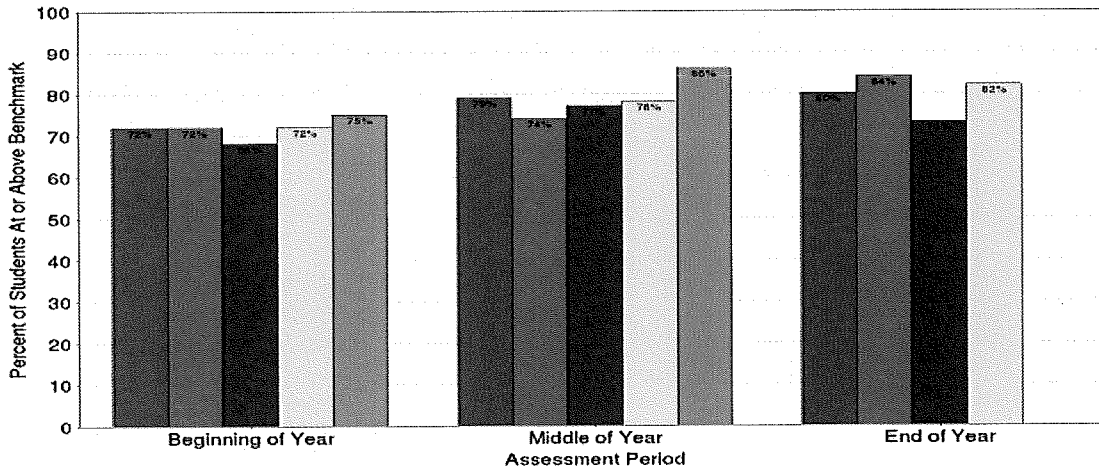

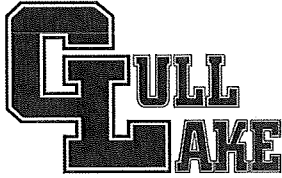


**Multi-Year Percent at Benchmark**
