

Your transcript is a permanent record of your high school coursework. Transcripts may be requested by future employers, the military, NCAA, scholarship agencies and post secondary institutions.

- <u>Class Rank</u> is used to determine Valedictorian & Salutatorian at GLHS. Some colleges will review your rank as part of the admissions process.
- **GPA** is cumulative. As trimester grades are added to your transcript, your GPA re-calculates as cumulative.
- Credits Earned: To be at junior status for the start of the 2022-2023 school year, you will need to have earned at least 12.50 credits by the end this summer. If you fail a required course you will need to repeat it.

English Language Arts Course Options

English: Four credits of English are required for Graduation

Required ELA courses must include:

Additional English /Language Arts electives include: Debate, Speech, Creative Writing, Multi Media & Reporting, Newspaper and Yearbook Publications (see pages 18-20 in the course curriculum guide)

Students interested in Yearbook Publications should complete an online application. Please see your counselor or Mrs. Jolin (in Room 1406) for the link. Yearbook does require a full year commitment (1.5 credits).

Mathematics Course Options

Math: Four credits of math are required and must include:

Algebra AB/Algebra 3 tri ABC Geometry AB/Concepts of Geometry AB Data Analysis AB/Concepts of Data Analysis AB Fourth Math/Math-Related Credit

A math/math related course must be completed during the **senior year** (see page 27 of the course curriculum guide)

Additional core math courses include: Trigonometry, Pre Calculus, AP Calculus, Statistics, AP Statistics, Land Surveying and Personal Finance.

Science Course Options

Three credits of Science are required and must include:

Biology or Concepts of Biology Physics or Chemistry (or Concepts versions) Third Science Elective

If you did not take Chemistry or Physics your sophomore year, please plan to take this in either your junior or senior year.

Additional science courses include *Environmental Science*, Anatomy/Physiology, Earth and Space Science A/B, AP Physics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry and several CTE Science Related Programs

Be sure to plan ahead as AP Physics (2023-2024) and AP Biology (2022-2023) run every other year.

Social Studies Course Options

Social Studies: Three and one half credits of Social Studies are required for graduation and must include:

Civics
US History or A.P. US History
World History or A.P. World History
Economics

Junior year, you have the option of World History or Advanced Placement World History. Please check with your current USH teacher if you are interested in taking AP World History.

Additional social studies electives include: Sociology, US History through Film, Psychology, and History of Eastern Religion and Cultures. See pages 32-34 of the Course Curriculum Guide for the course descriptions.

CTE/EFA Off-Site Options

- Career & Technigal Education (CTE) Programs and Education for the Arts (EFA) offer career training opportunities, possible college credit and co-op opportunities for students in Kalamazoo County (studentapplication.swmitech.org or see pages 41-50)
 - There is **NO cost** to the student for participating
 - Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from all off-site CTE/EFA programs
 - Most CTE/EFA off-site programs run for two blocks for the entire school year and will earn you 3.0 credits. Teacher Academy runs 5th block for 1.5 credits.
- CTE/EFA applications are due January 28th. We will be reviewing applications and students will receive a verification letter regarding their status.
 - CTE/EFA applications must be submitted online. See program options listing on pages 41-50.
- Many of the county wide CTE and EFA programs have limited space available and it is not unusual for you to be placed on a <u>waiting list</u> for a program.

Early College

- Early College is a rigorous five year high school program that will combine the best of high school with an early college experience.
- EC students will have the opportunity to earn their high school diploma along with college credits (up to an Associate's Degree) after completing 5 years of high school.
- For the Class of 2023, the State of Michigan does require a commitment to the EC Program by the end of the sophomore year.
- Informational meetings will be held in the High School Media Center on February 3 and April 28th. On March 22nd a informational meeting will be held online at 7:00 pm.

Early College continued

- Interested students should plan accordingly for sophomore year:
 - Attend an EC Information Meeting
 - □ Complete the EC application by March 1st for priority deadline and August 31st for final deadline
 - □ Sign up for or switch into Career and College Readiness
 - Apply this spring to KVCC/KCC/WMU
 - □ Take the Accuplacer placement test at KVCC
 - If you decide to take college courses as a junior, plan one block for each Fall/Winter course (1.5 per year) and complete the necessary paperwork with your counselor after meeting with the EC Academic Advisor

Planning Ahead

• NCAA: National Collegiate Athletic Association has set specific minimum academic standards for (college) freshman-eligibility.

• Potential athletes should create an account with the

NCAA Eligibility Center.

• Potential athletes are advised to check the listing of NCAA-approved courses, test scores and grade point average on the Eligibility Center's Website. This can be viewed at www.ncaaeligibilitycenter.net.

• All GLHS NCAA approved courses are noted under Standards along with the course descriptions in the Course Curriculum Guide.

Please note that not ALL virtual classes are NCAA approved.

Just so you know...

January 28th: CTE/EFA Applications are Due - you can still apply after January 28 but you will not be guaranteed a seat.

April: Sophomores with a cumulative 3.5 gpa at the end of the 2nd tri-mester will be invited to apply to the National Honor Society. A letter will be mailed to eligible students with more information.

June: Testing Out and AP summer materials will be available.

April – August: The Master Schedule will be built; teacher responsibilities assigned; and individual student schedules will be finalized.
